

Proposal to merge the Publications Committee with Website & Social Media Committee

- Currently, the Publications Committee produces monthly articles for the ASPE eNews blog. The Website and Social Media Committee works with the Publications Committee to distribute some of this content to social media.
- The Board of Directors proposes to join these two committees. The joint committee would be in charge of the ASPE eNews blog, website updates and social media posts.

Advantages:

- Operations efficiency - this will allow for a more streamlined flow of content to all platforms (blog, website and social media) as well as the eNews blog.
- Financial efficiency - this would reduce the Board of Directors by 1 member, saving expenses for ASPE related to Board Meeting attendance/accommodations/travel.

Considerations:

- The current chair of the Publications Committee (2020-2022) will have one year to helm the newly formed committee. The Vice Chair will have 1 year to prepare to Chair in 2022.

Cons:

- Online presence has grown in the past year, with increased coverage of programs and events including: Healthcare Simulation Week; Women in Leadership Symposium; ASPE Simulation Round tables and Social Hours due to COVID19. This has expanded the duties and coverage of the Website and Social Media Committee.
