Criteria:

- 1. A record of outstanding contributions to SP methodology or medical simulation education. Examples include:
 - a. Development of a new and innovative curricula or educational program
 - b. Novel approaches to SP methodology
 - c. Synthesis of existing educational theory to enhance educator understanding
 - d. Advocacy for high quality SP-based education on the national or international level
- 2. National or international recognition of expertise in SP methodology or medical simulation education
- 3. Scholarly achievement in the broad field of SP or medical simulation education with dissemination of work beyond their home institution. Examples include:
 - a. Peer reviewed publications
 - b. Invited editorials
 - c. Invited or competitively selected workshops at national or international meetings
 - d. Symposia or courses
 - e. Web-based publications of educational tools, course, or strategies
- 4. Evidence of experience of delivering presentations, workshops, seminars. Examples include:
 - a. International, national, regional, recognition of their work
- b. A record of invited presentations at national or international meetings or institutions other than their home institution
- c. Testimonials or recommendations from ASPE members, Conference Committee, or ASPE Board
